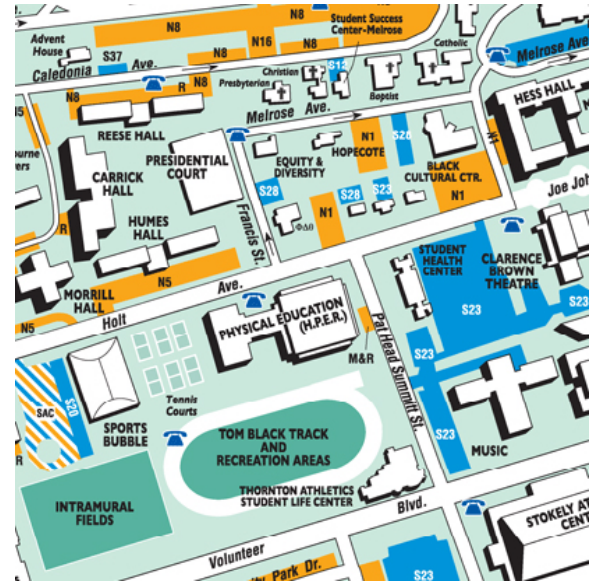


Graduate Performance students have access to a studio for their exclusive use which is referred to within the department as the Hyperspace. This space is located in the Health, Physical Education, and Recreation (HPER) building located just one block west of the Clarence Brown Theatre on Andy Holt Avenue. Access to HPER (pronounced Hyper)—is controlled via both keys and magnetic locks. The magnetic locks provide a means of entering and exiting the building only and are controlled with a pin code or by use of your UT ID card. Once inside, keys are required for movement through the building and to access the actual Hyperspace—Room B020. To get to the Hyperspace, enter the door under the E of the word “Education” on the building map at right and go down two levels to the basement.



ACCESS VIA UT ID AND/OR PIN



Once you have keys to HPER a pin code will be requested for you by the General Manager. As soon as your code has been entered into the system by the HPER Building Manager you will be contacted to come pick up your code. As these access codes are protected information under University policy, codes will not be provided via email or voicemail.

Once you have your pin, you must activate your UT ID by swiping it on any HPER door card-reader (shown at left) until the green light illuminates (this will take 1-3 swipes). Once the green light has illuminated, enter your pin followed by the pound sign. Your card is now activated and will unlock the HPER locks when swiped. If you forget to bring your card, you may enter your pin followed by the pound sign to unlock the doors.

NOTES ON SECURITY

Please be aware that every time your code is used to access the building a record of this is made. All doors to HPER are also equipped with cameras which make it possible for the Building Manager to verify the identity of persons using access codes. **DO NOT** give your code out to others as this may result in a revocation of usage privileges. The Department of Theatre **DOES NOT** control this building and has no say in who may or may not have access to the building. Please respect this as we also have no real recourse if your privileges are revoked. If you think your pin has been compromised or you lose your UT ID, please contact the Production Manager immediately so that your access code can be canceled and reissued.

All users of the Hyperspace should also be aware that all of HPER’s exterior doors automatically contact the UT Police if they do not properly close. Subsequently doors to HPER may not be propped open or held open for extended periods. As this area of campus is extremely high-traffic, users of the facility are required to check that doors they use close and lock properly both when entering and exiting the building. Failure to properly maintain the security of the building constitutes grounds for the revocation of usage privileges even if no theft or other damages result. You should never let anyone into the building unless you are willing to take full responsibility for their actions once inside. Remember, your pin will be the one recorded if you let someone else in.
